Barter Theatre's **Man of Constant Sorrow: The Story of the Stanley Brothers** was the most attended play in the history of Barter's Appalachian Festival of Plays and Playwrights (AFPP). After receiving further development, the show reopened this fall as a full production at Barter Stage II.

Man of Constant Sorrow has now been booked for a regional tour. Performances are set Oct. 20 at 8 p.m. at the **Paramount Center for the Arts** in Bristol (\$10-\$13) and Saturday, Oct. 22 at 7 p.m. at **The Lincoln Theatre** in Marion, VA (\$20), among others.

Barter is also planning to put the show on a national tour and is considering it for

production of the theatre's second-ever original cast recording, after the recent release of "Keep on the Sunny Side: The Songs and Stories of the Original Carter Family."

The musical follows the struggle of the Stanley Brothers from their humble beginnings on local TV and radio to the formation of the Clinch Mountain Boys, on through Carter's untimely death and Ralph's national prominence when he is named Best Male Country Vocalist and the soundtrack of *Oh Brother, Where Art Thou?* wins Album of the Year.
